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Reason for Amendment

Elderbridge Agency on Aging proposes to amend its SFY 2016-2017 Area Plan by adding Caregiver Supplemental Services as a new service. \$10,400 of Title III-E Family Caregiver Funds have been budgeted to support this proposed new service. Supplemental Services are services that would complement the care provided by caregivers such as home modifications, ramps, assistive devices, emergency response systems, and incontinence supplies. Elderbridge plans to serve 40 family caregivers this fiscal year through the Supplemental Services Program.

Even though Elderbridge already utilizes Title III-E Family Caregiver Funds to provide access assistance, counseling, options counseling, information services, and respite to family caregivers, a gap in services was identified by LifeLong Links staff. Options counselors identified many family caregivers that needed help to pay for ramps, hand-rails, widen doorways, improve access to bathtub and shower, and the peace-of-mind that personal emergency response systems would provide. Although this type of service was one that could be funded through Title III-E Family Caregiver Funds, Elderbridge had not budgeted any funding for the program.

In order to address this unmet need, Elderbridge would like to budget Title III-E Family Caregiver funding for a new Supplemental Services Program in its current Area Plan to fill a gap in services in order to complement the care provided by the family caregiver.
